INVITATION TO BID

The Department of Public Works of the Town of Goffstown, New Hampshire wishes to solicit bid proposals for the **Sewer Line Embankment Stabilization Project** located in the Town of Goffstown.

Contract Documents may be examined at the Department of Public Works Office, 404 Elm Street, Goffstown, New Hampshire 03045.

Copies of plans and specifications may be obtained from Spiller's Reprographics, 880 Second Street, Manchester, NH 03102 (Mon-Fri 7:30 A.M. - 5:00 P.M.) It is suggested that anyone wishing to pick up plans call in advance as they will be printed as requested. Their phone number is 603-644-3336 or 1-800-564-1559. Spiller's Reprographics accepts cash, checks or most major credit cards.

The work involves the following:

Stabilization of approximately 140 ft x 100 ft of river bank slope that supports an existing sewer line. The slope is to be stabilized by placement of riprap (partly in river waters) and erosion control mat. The project includes construction and removal of construction access road, removal and planting trees, installation of erosion and sedimentation controls, establishment of grass and installation of storm water interceptors.

Bid proposals will be accepted on enclosed bid forms and must state the price clearly. All proposals must be in a sealed envelope and marked clearly "**Sewer Line Embankment Stabilization Project**" and received no later than 2:00 P.M. on Tuesday, September 21, 2010. Bids will be publicly opened and will be read at that time by the Goffstown Public Works Director or designee and the Town Administrator or designee at the Town Hall. Notification will take place after bids have been reviewed by the Department of Public Works and a recommendation is made to, and then awarded by the Goffstown Sewer Commission.

It is anticipated that the project will be funded in part with a FEMA Hazard Mitigation Grant. The successful bidder will be required to comply with the provisions of the US Department of Labor's Davis – Bacon Act and shall require compliance in all subcontracts.
